

AP State Elections 2024 Opinion Poll

Period: 5th April, 2024 – 4th May, 2024

Introduction

- A comprehensive survey was carried out to gauge public sentiment regarding the government's performance over the previous five years and the preferences of the electorate ahead of the Andhra Pradesh elections.
- This study delves into perceptions, voting preferences, preferred CM Candidate, reason of choosing a party or Candidate.
- The survey is conducted from 5th Apr 2024 to 4th May 2024 (30 days).
- The report describes expected Party Vote share, Seat Share and preferred CM face, Occupation, Gender, Age group, Education Class wise Vote Share and their insights.

Approach

- Assumption of alliance: The survey was conducted under the assumption that the Telugu Desam Party (TDP), Jana Sena Party (JSP), and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) are forming an alliance for the upcoming elections.
- The study aimed to obtain a representative sample of the electorate and was carried out in each of Andhra Pradesh's 175 assembly constituencies.



Methodology

- The survey employed Systematic Random Sampling Methodology.
- The survey is taken in two phases (15 days each) in the duration stated above.
- The samples are collected during Face-to-Face interviews by skipping every 20 Households in the Randomly selected booths.
- The Survey process ensured that the sample includes representation from every age group, gender, and caste, Occupation Group, Educational Class.
- Our survey, which employed a thorough questionnaire, addressed a wide range of subjects, including voter priorities, candidate appraisal, and important factors impacting voting decisions, such as
 - Schemes Implementation/Regional Issues.
 - Policies for development.
 - Public Services and Governance
 - Dynamics of Caste and Communities

Expected Vote Share



- YSRCP is getting clear majority of 52.5%.
- Alliance is getting 41.3% of vote share.
- While 4.5% of the respondents said that they will vote for other parties like CPI, CPI (M) etc.

- As per the survey,
 - YSRCP is getting 136 seats.
 - While Alliance is getting 38 seats.
 - INC is getting 1 seat.


